## **Message from Pastor Lloyd**

#### YESTERDAYS MAN OR WOMAN Acts 76: 5-20

"Do not call something unclean if God has made it clean"!

Today's message centres around the thought that in the four 'image' areas I spoke about last week – God asks us to let him challenge us to leave behind in order to embrace the new. The message takes the account of Peters dream and its meaning for the new church God was birthing.

I'm going to ask you to think about specific areas in your own life where you need to 'let go (relinquish) in order to embrace'. Now take this thinking and re-examine the Bible accounts of those who walked in faith from Hebrews 11.

How many of these had to be willing to let go of what they knew or had in order to secure something new from God.

Living in our yesterdays is what we do more easily than our tomorrows. Yesterdays are known and proven, they are what our experience is based on. Yesterdays can be relied on not to let us down. Yesterdays don't trick us or deceive because even the failures and pitfalls of our yesterdays are familiar to us. But tomorrows is where people of faith live. Tomorrows is where Gods people are called to venture towards.

One of the best examples of this is found in the stories of King Saul (Yesterdays man) and David (Tomorrows man). Saul who chosen by the people to be king, but his character flaws of jealousy and disobedience resulted in him being rejected in favour of a young shepherd boy who had to wait 20 years to assume the throne. David refused to take the crown by force but waited for God time. Even David's weaknesses and sin did not preclude him from becoming Israel's greatest King. Because his heart was set on Gods glory and being tomorrow's man not yesterday's man.

Jesus had his most severe criticism not for the broken, the sinners and those for whom moral choice had led them into bondage and addictions – but for those who were the spiritual and who lived with the rules and regulations of the past that blinded them to where real truth and grace could be found. They were the Pharisee's whose lives looked so good and whitewashed on the outside but inside were blind to their own depravity and brokenness.

"I'm looking for tomorrow's people who will use their God given imprint, look past their relational history, think again about their exclusive prejudice, step around their feelings and choose me."

Where are you blinded by your own thinking? How have your broken emotions prevented you from forgiving? In what way have you chosen preferred relationships that you feel secure around to those God wants you to befriend? How does your choosing need saving this week?
