The Covid-19 situation is changing very quickly

Hi to all our church family and friends,

Yesterday afternoon the government decided there were to be no indoor events of 100 or more people - they have been banned indefinitely.

The following was advised by Health Minister Dr David Clark:

"Making sure we put in place social distancing rules is one of the most important things we can do to protect the public". He also explained for people who are not complying that "You are putting the health of your family, friends and your country at risk, it is up to all of us to unite to play our part for COVID 19." "Sanctions will be applied to those breaking the law," said Dr David Clark.

At this stage, they do not have a planned end date for this.

It is most important that we at Ranui Baptist comply with the government and the Ministry of Health.

This Sunday 22nd March and all future services at this point in time are cancelled. Please inform people who may not have email.

Pastor Matthew and the Elders are having a series of discussions and meetings to discuss viable alternative options for the church to meet over the next weeks and months which may include a combination of service options over the course of a week e.g. mid-week, Sunday morning, Sunday afternoon, etc. where each service will be limited to say 50-80 people.

We are also looking at the possibility and feasibility of having some form of video/web / live streamed service option.

Discussions are in very early days regarding our options as you will appreciate and may take a few weeks to arrange and finalise and so we will keep you updated on progress and outcomes.

However, in the meantime all Sunday services are cancelled so please don't come to the church on Sunday mornings.

Some small groups and home groups are still functioning and so we encourage you to go along to one of them for fellowship and Bible study.

Remember in these most challenging of times, Jesus is the same yesterday, today and forever and our Lord and God promises to never leave us or forsake us.

Blessings on you all in the name of Jesus.

Groups and few points to remember

The Covid-19 situation continues to evolve and with that our Ranui Baptist church response needs to as well.

We have also cancelled Sonshine Club, Mainly Music, the Op-shop, Allie's Thursday Group, Men's Group and Sonshine Club until further notice.

Some small groups may still be meeting at church; check with your group leader before coming to church.

A few points to remember:

Last Sunday in church, we talked about the importance of hygiene;

- washing hands regularly with soap and water for a minimum 20 seconds (the time to sing the happy birthday song to yourself twice over)
- using the hand sanitiser situated at one of the three entrances to the church EVERY TIME you enter the building and if for medical reasons you can't, then go directly to the bathroom to wash your hands.
- staying away from church if your unwell it is unfair and un-Christlike to come to church when sick and expose other people, particularly the elderly, to infection.
- if you do need to sneeze or cough, use the crook of your elbow/sleeve or a tissue to cover your mouth and nose.

Please Note:

If we find people not willing to use the hand sanitiser or washing their hands or coming to the church unwell we will be asking you to leave for the benefit and protection of everyone else - so please don't put anyone, including yourself in that awkward position.

Travellers and Self Isolation:

During the weekend you may have heard the government announcement requiring everyone returning to NZ from overseas from 1am Sunday 15th March onwards to go into 14 days of self-isolation.

On Wednesday they extended that, requesting everyone who has returned between 4th March to 15th March to do the same.

So we ask that if you, a family member or anyone you have been in close contact with, has returned to NZ in that time frame, please go into self-isolation and stay away from the church until you and they have completed their 14 day self-isolation.
