#### **CORE VALUES NO 3 - WE VALUE TRUTH OVER COMFORT**

The story of Peter's restoration by Lake Galilee has always moved me deeply. I guess it impacts me because I so much identify with the bumbling energy-filled disciple Peter. But it's also his public fall from grace that undoes him so much. There seems no way back into the hallowed intimacy of the 12 after such a pathetic display of non -loyalty. And it's the way Jesus dealt with him which is an outstanding example of grace. He not only forgave him but he entrusted him with a greater mission and endeavour. It just goes against everything we usually do when someone disappoints us. And once again it's the kingdom way of doing something 'different' to the world. Before our eyes we saw last week how the World handles those who fail and fall; they are marginalised, isolated, and dismissed. But the way of the kingdom is to search the 'heart' not amplify the failure!!!!!!

Going through theological college many times I have been challenged with this issue; do I truly believe the Bible or will I take the easier pathway of less resistance and more popularity? But the verse that has kept me on the straight and narrow way – "Seek Ye first the Kingdom, and all other things will be added to you" (Matthew 6.33).

So many times in the Bible we are called to follow Jesus into places and situations that might feel uncomfortable but the core value of the kingdom is that truth trumps comfort. We are not promised comfort but in fact, we are promised difficult times, opposition, and misunderstanding. Many of us know what it feels like to be betrayed or misrepresented and for people not to be able to hear our perspective on some matter. But we need to remember when we are truly motivated by the truth we need not fear. There is freedom in the truth but not necessarily comfort.

I've found following Jesus to not only be the most adventurous, enriching life but the times when I have been betrayed or disappointed with people – I have asked the question of myself. "Did I stand for the truth?" "Was there integrity and authentic motivation beneath my choices or speech"? "Have I modeled my behaviour on biblical principles"? If I can honestly give three ticks to these searching questions, then come what may – I will value truth over comfort and gladly bear the reproach that results.

We live in a world where comfort is the goal of many people's lives. Their daily choices are based on what will result in comfort. More assets, bigger bank balance, better career or prospects of promotion. But what happens when a daily choice asks us to choose the way of the cross (following Jesus) rather than that which will bring earthly comfort? When such opportunities come our way God gives us the courage to be true 'followers' of Jesus and place a higher value on truth than comfort.
