I CAN SEE CLEARLY NOW - Mark 8:22-26

This is the only record in the gospels where partial healing took place, and it required a second prayer by Jesus to be fully effective. So, the natural question is why? Even the Son of God could not affect complete healing on the first occasion. We must therefore assume that there was purpose in the partial healing – and that there is some message for us in this. Could it be that God is trying to remind us that there are times when we can only get a partial insight into what we can see? Are there times when we see 'darkly' or faintly what later we see clearly and with greater clarity? What are some of the instances in your own life where a partial insight in clarity has been followed sometime later by a greater sense of clear thinking?

Today I propose that there are three areas where we need to see more clearly. Copies of my message can be obtained in the church foyer or online. Have a great week.
