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NORTHERN REGION HUI 5-6 AUGUST 2022

I had the privilege and was most encouraged to attend the Northern Region Baptist Hui at Tikipunga church for two days. Having met most of the leaders in the New Zealand Baptist church I took the opportunity to connect with other pastors and elders. I now have a much better insight as to the direction in which the church is moving.

As faith communities are coming out of the covid lockdowns many churches and pastors are struggling. It is seen as a time when churches can embrace new initiatives and ways of doing ministries and reaching their communities. The Baptist church leader Charles Hewlett (a good listener and an articulate speaker) outlined four points for faith communities to focus on.

1. Robust leadership.
2. Discipleship (evangelism and nurture)
3. Sharing of Resources (this led to growth in the Acts' church)
4. Mission.

The theme of the Hui was inclusion for all people. The question was asked how are we empowering the emerging generations to lead now? Four churches briefly outlined how they were emerging from lockdowns;

- 1st church with husband/wife co-pastors have no venue of their own and are going through a culture of prayer/discussion/decision making. In short discernment.
- 2nd church wanted to take the church out into the community and are developing home churches but still meeting once a month as one church.
- 3rd church returned home from years as an army chaplain and a small community – visited homes in their northern catchment to assess each site and planted 600 vegetable gardens in homes in their district – doing something physical to do something spiritual.
- 4th church multicultural community church where their starting point is “what does our community need?”
