After working in different industries for more than a decade, he joined Mission Without Borders as the Partnership & Development Manager in February 2022. As someone who grew up in an atheistic and communist environment, he is now passionate about evangelism which is a true miracle from God. A single, torn-out Bible page was all a pastor in the USSR had to preach from for seventeen years. Showing this to Mission Without Borders' founders, he challenged them to.... "put Bibles into Eastern Europeans' empty hands to reach our own people." And that's exactly what they did! Whilst the context where we work has changed significantly in the last 60 years, our Mission has stayed the same - reaching people for Christ.
