#### Isaiah 40:31

The most Vital verse of 2022 was Isaiah 40:31 "but those who hope in the LORD will renew their strength. They will soar on wings like eagles; they will run and not grow weary; they will walk and not be faint". These were words God had Isaiah prophesy for the era of exile decades in the future.
