

This Week's Sermon: The Call of God on a Life

We are continuing this morning with our four-part series on Jonah. Jonah is unique among the prophetic books. Rather than a list of prophecies, it is about a single mission in a man's life. Last week we looked at the call of God on Jonah's life and how Jonah turned away from that call. We discovered that he had a callous disregard for the spiritual welfare of the people in Nineveh.

He had tasted grace and came to faith in God. He was walking with God, but he would not sacrifice so that others would know God as well. We talked about the 'Jonah spirit', a spirit that would not even consider the message of God going to those in Nineveh. This morning, we learn about the hand of God on a life. The intervention of God in a life. Now the Lord provided a huge fish to swallow Jonah, and Jonah was in the belly of the fish three days and three nights. Jonah 1: 17.

We are going to look at that part of Jonah that involved God's intervention into his life by providing a great fish to rescue him. God wasn't punishing Jonah; he was saving him. God intervened supernaturally in his life. If you believe in an all-powerful God capable of miracles, then this is not actually that big of a deal. Take note of the words of G. Campbell-Morgan. "If you focus on the great fish, you will miss the great God".

While Jonah was in the great fish he prayed to God and God answered him. Jonah realised that God was not just saving him but wanted the same for the city of Nineveh. It took God's intervention in his life and Jonah's experience in the storm and his days inside a great fish to rediscover the wonders of God's love for the lost. When he says in verse 9, But I, with shouts of grateful praise, will sacrifice to you. What I have vowed I will make good. I will say, 'Salvation comes from the Lord.'" Jonah. He wasn't learning anything new, he was rediscovering the heart, truth and wonder of the gospel.
