This Week's Sermon: Pastor Grahame What's the Difference between Judaism & Christianity

We're in a series on the difference between Christianity and other major world religions. Last week we kicked it off with a look at the difference between Christianity and religions from the east, particularly Hinduism and Buddhism. Today, we're going to explore the religion that gave birth to not only the Christian faith, but the Islamic faith as well - Judaism.

Judaism is the oldest of the world's great monotheistic religions, meaning those religions that believe in one and only one God, as opposed to polytheism, which is the belief in multiple gods. If you have a background in Christianity at all, Judaism is not difficult to understand. Their Bible is part of our Bible. We share the Old Testament, or what they call the Tanach.

However, there are some strong points of connection between Judaism and Christianity. Firstly, let us not forget that Jews were the first to worship Jesus as God. Jesus' first followers were all devout Jews familiar with the Hebrew Scriptures. It would be reasonable to assume that they must have understood various Old Testament passages in a way that would have allowed them to accept Jesus as Messiah who is with us.

What about Jesus as Messiah? For many Jews this remains the biggest challenge to accepting Jesus as we should be patient and prayerful about their response. As the Apostle Paul explains, For I am not ashamed of the gospel, because it is the power of God that brings salvation to everyone who believes: first to the Jew, then to the Gentile. For in the gospel the righteousness of God is revealed —a righteousness that is by faith from first to last, just as it is written: "The righteous will live by faith." Romans 1: 16-17.

As Christians, we must always remember that Jesus sent the Holy Spirit to guide us in all things. Including talking to those from other faiths. He will prepare the people to be ready for our words before we even meet them. It is he who will draw them to Jesus and our role is to be obedient and follow his prompting.


